WORKSHOP TIMINGS

Your workshop will run from 09:00-17:00 on Day 1 09:00-16:45 on Day 2 and 09:00-12:30 on Day 3.

A detailed timetable will be sent out in the final information and you should also receive an agenda showing the times from your workshop leader in due course.

Please aim to arrive at Raffles World Academy between 08:30 and 09:00 on Day 1 to collect your name badge.

You should be able to easily achieve flights from Dubai International Airport from 16:00 on Day 3. If you are aiming for a fast get-away at the end of the workshop, please contact our Help Desk at the event as they may be able to help you with sharing and booking taxis.



Getting there

If arriving by **car**, there is plenty of parking available at the front of the school.

Driving Directions: Head for Junction 4 (exit 39) on the Sheikh Zayed Road, signposted D63 Umm Suqeim Road (West), also signposted for the Burj Al Arab and Madinat Jumeirah. At the main junction at the end of Umm Suqeim Road, turn right into (302) Jumeirah Beach Road, heading towards Dubai and the Burj al Arab/Jumeirah Beach Hotel. Turn right at the Emirates Bank (directly opposite the Burj al Arab). At the end of the road, turn left and then second right into Al Marcup Street. The Raffles World Academy is on Al Marcup Street on the right-hand side.









Dubai has two world-class airports – Dubai International Airport (DXB) and Dubai World Central (DWC). Both offer transport options for getting into the city. Sharjah Airport is also an option although this is a further distance by taxi.

Once you are in Dubai, there are plenty of <u>public or private transport options</u>, including <u>Dubai Metro</u> and taxis are plentiful and cheap and can be hailed from the side of the road. They can be paid for with cash (UAE Dirhams) or a credit/debit card. Be aware that you might be offered a black limo from the airport (sometimes the taxi rank officials try to direct you to these especially if it is busy), but these are more expensive than the normal cream-coloured taxis. Single female travellers might want to look out for "pink" roofed taxis which are driven by female drivers.

While in Dubai, you can book taxis via the <u>Careem</u> app on your smartphone and will be offered either a Careem car or a standard taxi. If you need to telephone for a taxi at any point, the number to use is 800 88088. Alternatively, you can use Uber in Dubai.

If you are resident in Dubai and wish to drive to Raffles World Academy, there is plenty of parking at the front of the school.

WHERE TO STAY

This is a particularly busy time in Dubai with a number of major conferences taking place.

We suggest staying in either the Umm Suqeim or Al Barsha areas of Dubai.

We will provide bus transportation from the Novotel Al Barsha hotel (which is centrally located near to a number of other hotels in the Al Barsha area, close to the Mall of the Emirates and lots of shops and restaurants). The first bus will leave at 08:00 and the second bus at 08:15 on Day 1 and at 08:15 and 08:30 on Days 2 and 3 respectively. If you wish to use the bus transportation please let us know before 15 January 2025 at admin@ibicus.org.uk.

There are many other 3 and 4* hotels in the Al Barsha area including the IBIS Al Barsha, Holiday Inn, Golden Tulip, Rose Park and Hilton which are all a short distance from the Novotel.

The closest hotels to Raffles World Academy are the Lemon Tree and Metropolitan Hotel Dubai which are in the Umm Sugeim area.

The best rates for any of these hotels appear to be via Booking.com, Hotels.com, Trivago or similar hotel booking sites or if you are a loyalty club member, you might wish to use your own booking methods.

Please note that we do not recommend that you make any non-refundable travel or accommodation arrangements until you have received confirmation in writing that your workshop will go ahead. We reserve the right to cancel any workshops which do not gain sufficient bookings to make them viable to run.

IBICUS will provide bus transportation from Raffles World Academy to the Novotel Al Barsha at the end of each day. Note that the Novotel Al Barsha is close to a metro station which you can use to go towards either the Marina or Downtown Dubai.

TEN THINGS TO DO IN DUBAI

- 1. Go up the Burj Khalifa (book in advance online) or just go and watch the fountains at the foot of it at Dubai Mall https://www.burjkhalifa.ae
- 2. Wander around Al Fahidi Historical Neighbourhood in Bur Dubai, with its winding alleyways and wind towers. Get a taste of Old Dubai during the mid-19th century.
- 3. Visit Dubai Creek and take in the Gold Souq and Spice Souq, cross the creek on an Abra (small boat) or walk along Al Seef area https://alseef.ae/en
- 4. Visit a museum, Dubai Museum, Etihad Museum or Museum of the Future (this one has to be booked a month or so in advance online) https://museumofthefuture.ae
- 5. Go skiing at Mall of the Emirates, indoor ski slope or just enjoy the snow https://www.skidxb.com
- 6. Explore Madinat Jumeriah with its modern souq and plenty of restaurants; there is also The theatre of the Digital Age to visit https://www.toda.ae/en/
- 7. Take a walk along the beach alongside Jumeriah Beach Road or use a scooter or bike
- 8. Take in a show at Dubai Opera https://www.dubaiopera.com
- 9. Travel to the Palm, visit Nakheel Mall or The Atlantis
- 10. Go on a desert safari, city tour or dhow cruise or take a trip to Abu Dhabi to see the amazing Sheikh Zayed Grand mosque

- Still visit Dubai Mall, even if shopping doesn't interest you. It has an ice-rink, indoor aquarium and you can watch the fountains at the foot of the Burj Khalifa
- Consider using the metro to get around to sightsee You need to buy single, return and day-pass tickets or a cashless smart card known as NoI on the metro

DON'T

- Swear in public or made rude gestures you can get yourself into big trouble
- Take somebody's picture without their consent, it is considered as an invasion of privacy of that person.
 It is also illegal to take photos of strategic and military locations, government organisations or political buildings for security reasons
- Eat, drink or chew gum on public transport
- Consume alcohol in public places or drink and drive
- Indulge in Public Displays of Affection

FAQs

What is included in the workshop fee?

Tuition from workshop leaders, all workshop materials, lunches and refreshments and admin support during the event.

How do I get from the airport to my hotel?

By far the easiest way is to take one of the many and reasonably priced taxis which are right outside the airport terminal. These are safe at any time of the day and single lady travellers are often offered a female driver (pink roofed taxi).







When do the workshops start?

Please come through the main school entrance between 08:30 and 09:00 on Day 1 of your workshop to register and collect your name badge.

There is no need to register at the front desks on subsequent days.

What should I wear?

Casual dress, but respectful of the local culture.

What to bring

Any materials requested in advance by your

workshop leader, including your subject guide (there will be no spare copies on site).

Bring either electronic or paper versions as you prefer.

Do I need an electrical adaptor?

The electricity current is 220/240volts and requires 3-pin plugs (UK plugs work without an adaptor).

Can I access the internet at the school?

Wi-Fi is available in most areas of the school for your own smart phone/laptop. School ICT facilities are also available during break times.

What meals are provided?

Lunches and refreshments – including vegetarian options - are provided on Day 1 and Day 2 during the workshop. On Day 3 we finish before lunch but will provide refreshments at the morning break. If you have any special dietary requirements, please let us know at the time of booking or if you have already booked, please email admin@ibicus.org.uk before the workshop dates.

Is alcohol available in Dubai?

Dubai's licensing laws require venues serving alcohol be attached to hotels or a private clubs. It is illegal to drink in the street or in a public space.

What is the currency in Dubai?

The currency in the UAE is the Arab Emirates Dirham (AED).

What is the time difference?

The UAE is 4 hours ahead of GMT.

Do I get a Certificate after the event?

Yes, this will be sent to you as a PDF document around 2 weeks after the event.

How do I evaluate the workshop?

You will be emailed a link to complete an online evaluation form.

Where are the best places to shop?

Shopping is a pastime in Dubai whether in souks or malls. Mall of the Emirates (close to the workshop venue) and Dubai Mall (downtown but next to the world-famous Burj Khalifa) are extremely popular and are very busy in the evenings and at weekends.
